Dear Friends and Supporters,



The Mothers Overcoming Maternal Stress (M.O.M.S.) program is a voluntary home visiting program for women who are pregnant or have a child under the age of one living in Broward County. The M.O.M.S. program provides counseling, parenting education, case management services, and support groups to women who are experiencing depression, anxiety, and difficulty bonding with the baby during pregnancy and postpartum. Services are provided in English, Spanish, and Creole.



Key Participant Outcomes

80% of mothers will report fewer symptoms of depression and/or anxiety



85% of mothers will demonstrate acceptable level or improvement of attachment/bonding with target infant




85% of infants and children will score within range of developmental milestones.








Participants by Educational Level

Healthy Families is a nationally-accredited family support and coaching program that helps parents provide the safe and stable environments children need for healthy growth and development. Parents voluntarily participate in services provided in their homes. Specially-trained support workers help them improve their parenting skills and achieve goals that increase family stability and self-sufficiency. HMHB Broward is one of five sites within Broward County that partners with the Broward Regional Health Planning Council (BRHPC) to provide services.



Focus children will be up-to-date with immunizations at 24 months of age.


Mothers enrolled in the project will not have a subsequent pregnancy within two years of the target child's birth











The Mahogany Project is a health education program targeting high-risk pregnant women in the 33311, 33023, 33313, 33319, 33060, and 33068 zip codes. Mothers learn how to monitor and improve their health. They also learn how to care for and maintain the health of their baby through parenting education. Mahogany clients are also connected with community resources to meet their family's needs.


Clients' babies born in the program survive past the age of one year.





- Customized exercises and activities designed by a Certified Personal Trainer delivered through an app
- Nutrition counseling and education by a Certified Health Coach
- Cooking Demonstrations
- Health Education
- Health Assessments
- Care Coordination
- Doula Support

Participants are assessed for Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) conditions and connected to community resources.




